"Return to Camelot" Promises Medieval Adventure for Returning Alumni

(PRWEB) February 14, 2005 -- The Justin F Kimball Alumni Association, a Dallas based non-profit educational organization, is hosting a June 2006 Gala for all graduates of Kimball High School. The Gala Committee has selected a theme calling for all Knights of Kimball to "Return to Camelot".

This is the first gathering of all classes that have graduated from the Dallas high school. Kimball was established in 1958 and graduated its first class in 1960. Since then, over 24,000 students have passed through the halls of Kimball. The Alumni Association

(www.justinfkimball.org) now consists of 45 years of alumni and the Gala is intended to bring them all together in a fundraiser for the school.

The Gala production is being staged by **Don Ross Nabb Productions** at the Studios of Las Colinas, a Dallas location where many film and television programs are produced. The Gala promises to transport the Alumni back to medieval times beginning with a moat at the entrance to the event and complete with knights in armor and wenches to

serve.

Over 1000 Kimball Knights are expected to "Return to Camelot" where the Kimball High School Marching Band and a musical program by former band members will treat them to a performance.

Michael Carroll, the executive chef of Don Ross Nabb Productions. has prepared the Bill of Fare menu and he has spared nothing in the extraordinary food selections. Featured are a carving station of roast beef round and a fully stuffed pig. Beef and chicken kabobs and smoked turkey legs round out the entrees. A separate area promises delectable desserts of bananas foster and assorted pastries.

The Gala website is located at www.kimballalumnigala.org where all the details can be found. Early sign up is encouraged and tickets are provided for a charitable donation of \$75.00 per person. Under IRS tax rules, \$50.00 of the donation is deductible on your individual income taxes as a charitable

contribution. The deduction will save each person \$10.00 to \$20.00 per ticket using the deduction meaning that the true cost of attending the Gala is between \$50.00 and \$60.00.

This is no simple reunion format!

The committee, despite the grandeur of the Gala, has worked hard to make it affordable for all to attend, especially since it is over a year away.

We encourage everyone to sign up early to save on ticket prices but also to allow us to complete the financial requirements of the event.

Please don't wait until the last minute!

Take your tax deduction of \$50.00 in January, 2006 before the event to maximize your savings by making your donation for the event in 2005.

The Gala promises to be a magical evening in Camelot where Knights and Princesses gather at the Round Table to enjoy food, merriment and renew their friendships and loyalty to Kimball High School. Truly a superb event destined to be remembered!

Board of Governors Define Major Goals

The Board of Governors in consultation with the Principal and Faculty has reviewed the student body experience and has agreed to assist in the areas listed below. The Association cannot fund all of the areas but can provide supplemental funds as they become available to them. There are, in the minds of the members of the Board, several crucial areas that represent history and tradition but are not currently in place at the school. Also, there are other areas that need attention. While every project cannot be accomplished at once, the alumni body can begin to add to the school's ability to once again begin to provide the programs that will enhance student life at Kimball. That's our way of "Reaching Back to Reach Out"!

Priority Projects

- Yearbook: There has not been a yearbook published since 1994 for the students because there is a lack of funding to get it done due to district budgets. This yearbook, as we all know, provides the recorded history of our classes and events. Most of us to this day still retain ours and it should be a necessary part of Kimball Life. Even the political process of electing class officers and favorites has gone by the wayside. Subsidizing a small portion of the cost will go a long way to make it affordable for every student.
- Newspaper: The Knight Life and the Yearbook are all items published by a journalism class. Providing these two publications are valuable tools that benefit the students long into the future. Sales, marketing, public relations, graphic design and many other areas are really skills that the publications provide and should be a priority. This school effort has provide many who are today in America's newspapers, magazines and television. It is an invaluable course and project.
- Scholarship Program: The scholarship program can be and is the most important contribution that can be made to change lives one at a time. The Board has initiated a modest scholarship program for one boy and one girl. The Principal and Faculty will assess and recommend those who should be considered each year based upon their academics, citizenship, leadership and most importantly, a financial need to continue their education. No other worthy contribution can be made by each of us in the Alumni Association than this program and we hope to expand it each year.
- The Arts: This year, David Curry, Class of 78, has compiled a slide show of all the senior play productions that were held at Kimball. Those productions were professional because we had the funds for scripts, props, lighting and other tools to put on a first class production. Currently, the school has in place a one-act play in the fall and the senior play is a production lacking support for the areas to make it a great production. All of us know, the arts programs at high schools are rapidly disappearing because of budget priorities and they are a vital part of an education and should not be lacking.
- <u>Student Life:</u> The Sweetheart Dance is no more and should be reinstated.
 Currently, the school sponsors only two events. The Homecoming Dance usually held in the Gym, and the Senior Prom, which is low budget. The Military Ball is funded by the military and is taken care of but the Association can support the other important social gatherings for the students.
- <u>Athletic Department:</u> Coach Jordan and his coaching staff has many needs between which is the proper tools to train and prepare the athletes for competition. As we all are aware, competing in today's athletic world requires a great deal. Chief among being prepared is to review game films past and of future competitors. Coach Jordan and his staff are to be congratulated for keeping the Knights in the Regional playoffs but he still needs proper camera equipment and other items to prepare the team.

Next on the athletic list, is that aside from the football program and often overlooked when funding is necessary are the other athletic programs. Boy's and Girl Basketball teams travel to many tournaments and some have to be overlooked because transportation cannot be afforded. It is true for track and swimming. Band and Orchestra members have needs too. It for Cheerleading contests and training.

• Academics: Students now are required to take the TAAS test in order to graduate and it is required to be taken by Juniors but not by Sophomores (which is optional). Even though test scores are rising, there is a need to provide an incentive for Sophomores to take the test in order to provide an early shot at passing the test and if not, then allowing them an extra opportunity to pass it in their Junior year. Any request to take tests requires incentives! Even small incentives can be the trigger to accomplish this. Movie and skating tickets, Six Flag and sport tickets are some ways to push the students to enroll in the early program.

At the end of the day student life can be improved with our assistance. We certainly cannot take the place of the DISD's responsibility to provide proper funding for the school but that is NOT OUR PURPOSE in assisting the school and student body. It is about helping when help is needed and giving back to that from which we have received. It is easy to walk away and ignore something far back in our memory but that position only leads to the destruction and elimination of institutions that bolster our lives and the future world our grandchildren will live in. So the Alumni Association calls each of us to noble service by supporting the Alumni Association and the goals set forth by the Board of Governors.

The 2006 Gala is happy to be the lead event in beginning the process of achieving those goals and thank each and every one of you for your support and attendance.

Locating lost alumni will take everyone participating!

Finally, a serious effort will be made this year to take the lost lists of each class and use the internet, phone and public data to locate our lost alumni or to discover that they have left this earth.

Finding the lost alumni:

First, check your class lost list and discover who is missing. Then forward any information to webmaster@justinfkimball.org so that we can follow up and verify.

Secondly, if each of us would use the Internet for one hour a week looking up the lost alumni, it would help a great deal. Using the Internet white pages or search engines like Google, Yahoo, Anywho are the best places to start. Also, you can enter "Kimball High" or "Justin F Kimball" into the search engines and anyone on the Internet who has reference to the school on a page will be shown.

Thirdly, can provide a clue as to where to start? Maybe make a call to parents who still live in the same location. Call another classmate who was friends with a lost classmate and ask them if they are still in touch.

Fourthly, in the case of female graduates, do you know of their married name?

And, finally, if you are a Gold member of Classmates.com, you can send up to 50 emails a day to alumni who are not registered or lost to the Association.

Building our database of registered alumni is crucial to future successes of class reunions and to know if any of our classmates have passed away. Please be vigilant in helping us complete this work.
